Children's Home Society of New Jersey Gets Trenton Children Dancing Investors Bank Grants \$3,000 for Trenton Education Dance Institute

ROBBINSVILLE, New Jersey – Alyssa Alvarez, aged 16, has been involved in the Trenton Education Dance Institute (TEDI), a member of Associates of National Dance Institute, for five years. Alvarez, who someday would like to be a nurse, said that TEDI has taught her "how to feel confidence in doing what you love." Thanks, in part to \$3,000 in grants from the Investors Foundation and the Roma Bank Community Foundation, Alvarez and other students involved in TEDI will continue dancing!

The Children's Home Society of New Jersey is a nonprofit organization that helps at-risk infants, children, youth, and families achieve their potential by providing adoption options, birth parent counseling, child abuse prevention and treatment, child care services, community and neighborhood-based services, foster care, pre- and post-natal services, school-based youth services, child welfare services, kinship services, early childhood and parenting services.

Since 2011, The Children's Home Society of New Jersey has been partnering with TEDI to offer a tailored curriculum which challenges students' cognitive and physical capabilities. The youth development programs include:

- Weekly, in-school classes for fifth-graders in two Trenton public elementary schools;
- "First Team" classes for TEDI kindergarten students;
- After-school SWAT Team (Scholarship for the Willing, Achieving & Talented) program for selected TEDI fifth- graders;
- Celebration Team Scholarship Program for sixth through tenth-grade TEDI alumni; and,
- TEDI Alumni Association for program graduates.

Each May, the TEDI program holds an end of year event with live performances for school, family and community audiences. Importantly, TEDI inspires students to achieve both as individuals and group members, while promoting self-esteem and life skills such as self-discipline, teamwork, concentration, cooperation, confidence and pride in personal achievement. Students like eleven-year-old Ahmilliyon McRae, who said TEDI has taught her "to never give up."
